VISION

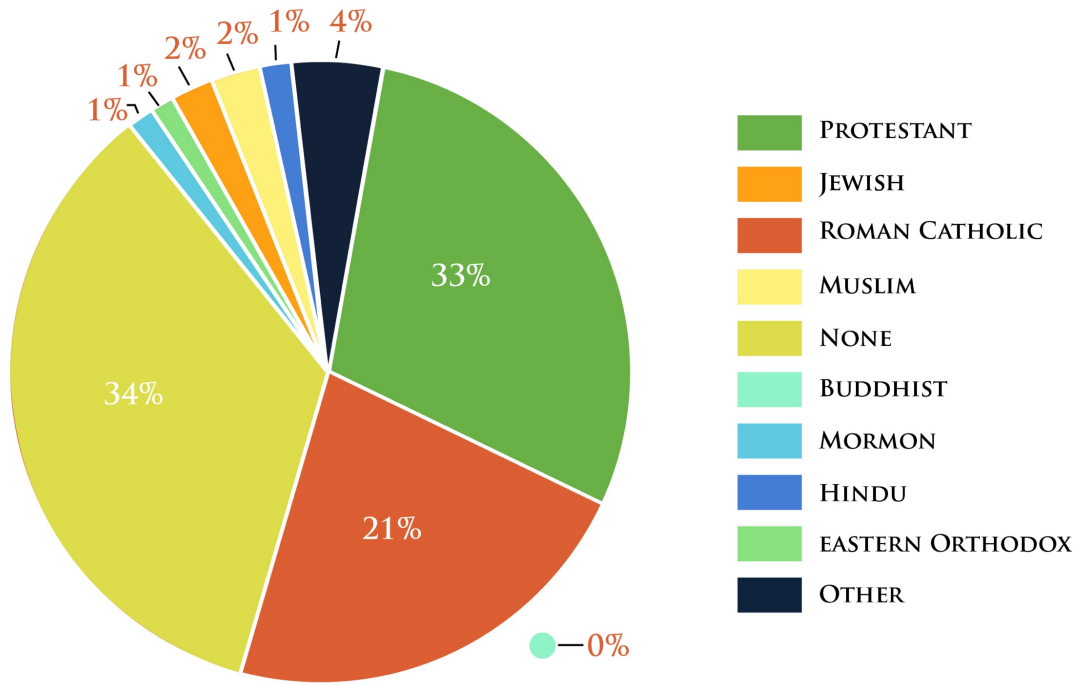
MCP's vision is to work hand-in-hand with faith-based leaders to improve health and education, reduce inequality, and spur economic growth.
